# Background

- Paris declaration on Aid effectiveness
- The Post 2015 Agenda
- ▶ Since 2000, OECD-DAC members increased from \$53.9 bill (adj.) to \$134.8 bill 2014, largely to achieve MDGs
- ▶ EU's DCI committing to €19.7 billion for SDGs in next 6 years.
- ▶ **The Donors and partner Countries are committing to**
  - ▶ Strengthening partner countries' national development strategies and associated operational frameworks (e.g., planning, budget, and performance assessment frameworks)
  - ▶ Eliminating duplication of efforts and rationalising donor activities to make them as cost-effective as possible
  - ▶ Etc.

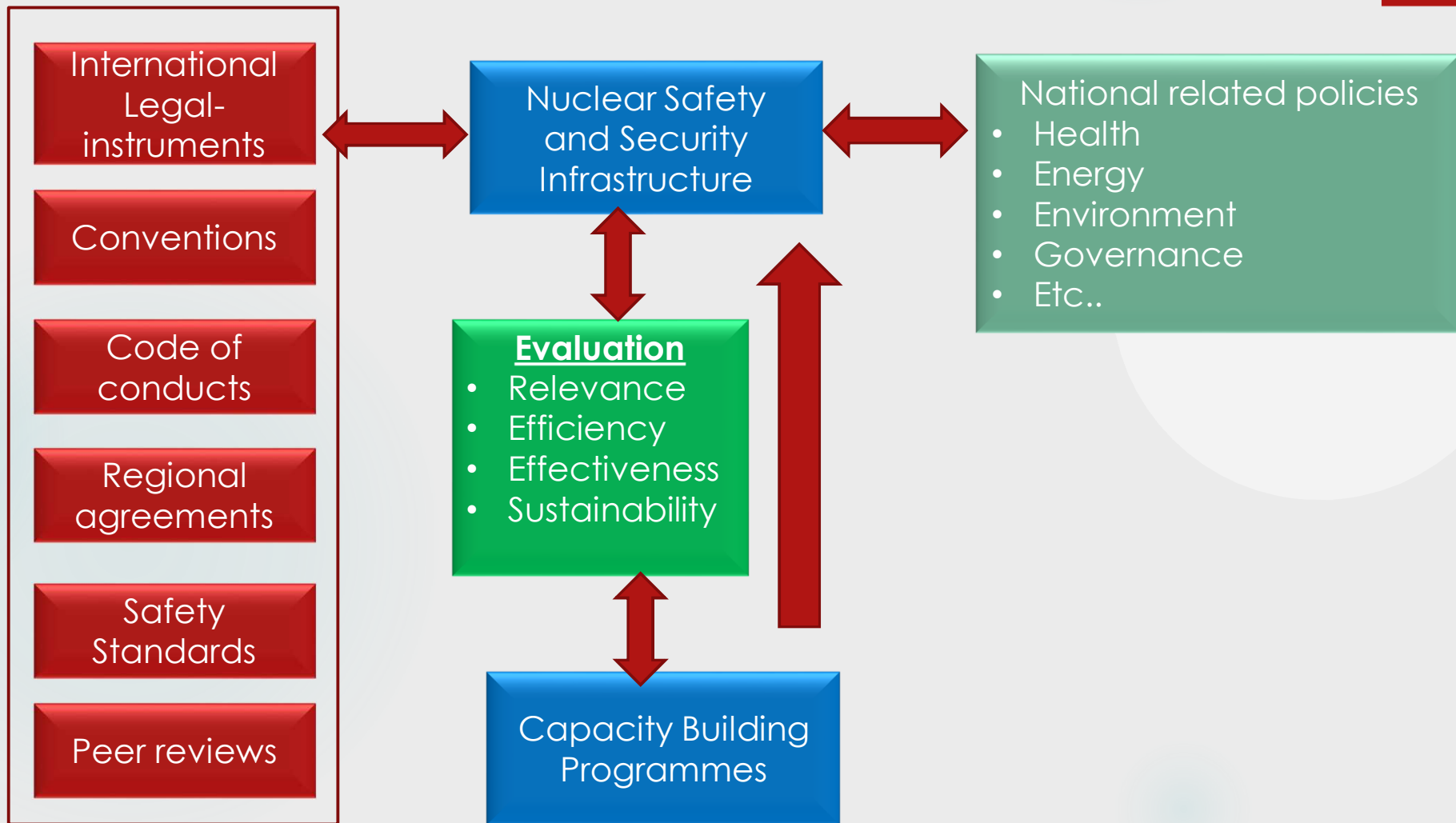
# Challenges of technical support programmes

- ▶ Limited country leadership and capacity to plan and implement programs → **Donors develop own plans and programs**
- ▶ Too little coordination among donors → **Dispersed effort, suboptimal use of resources**
- ▶ Too many projects with different procedures → **Countries cannot handle these demands.**

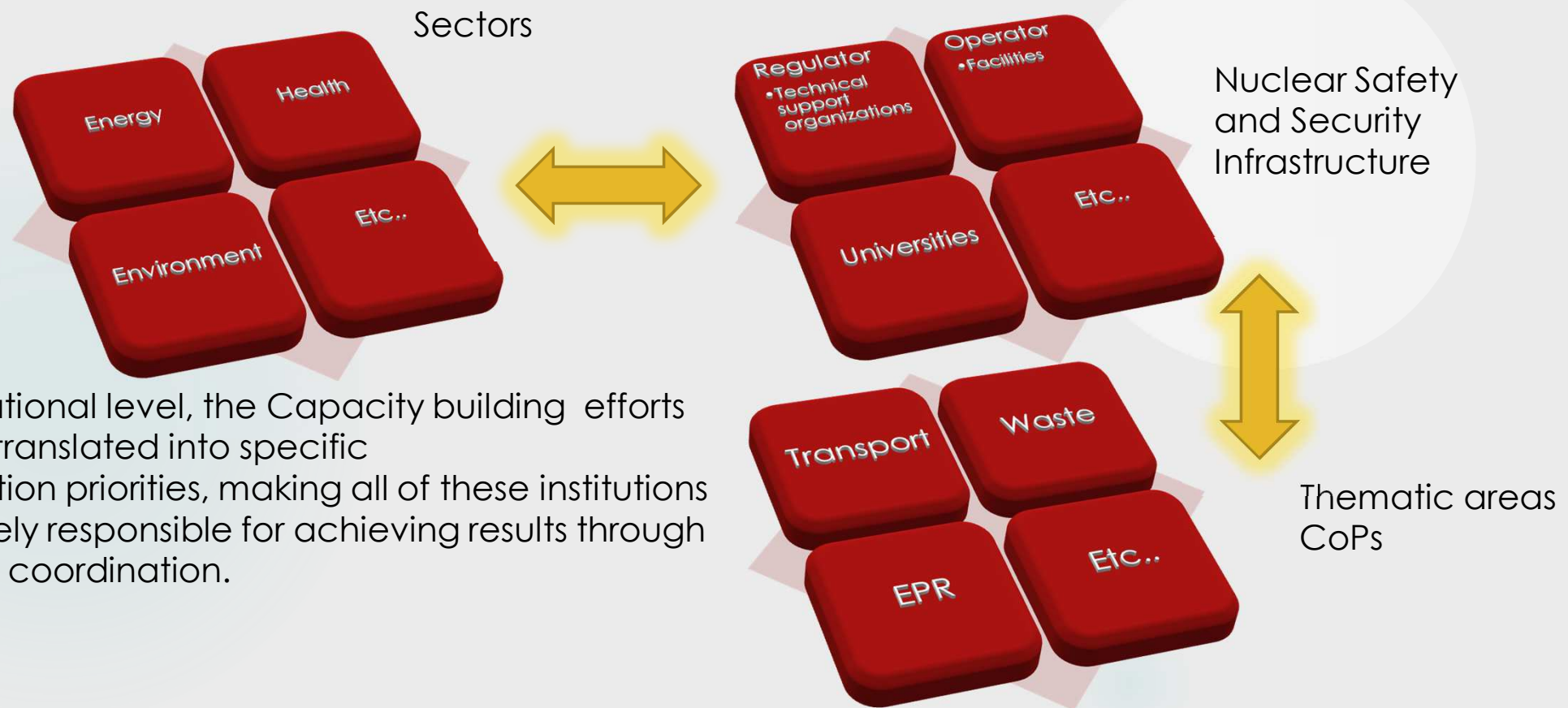
# Objectives of the Partnership

# The National context: internal factors



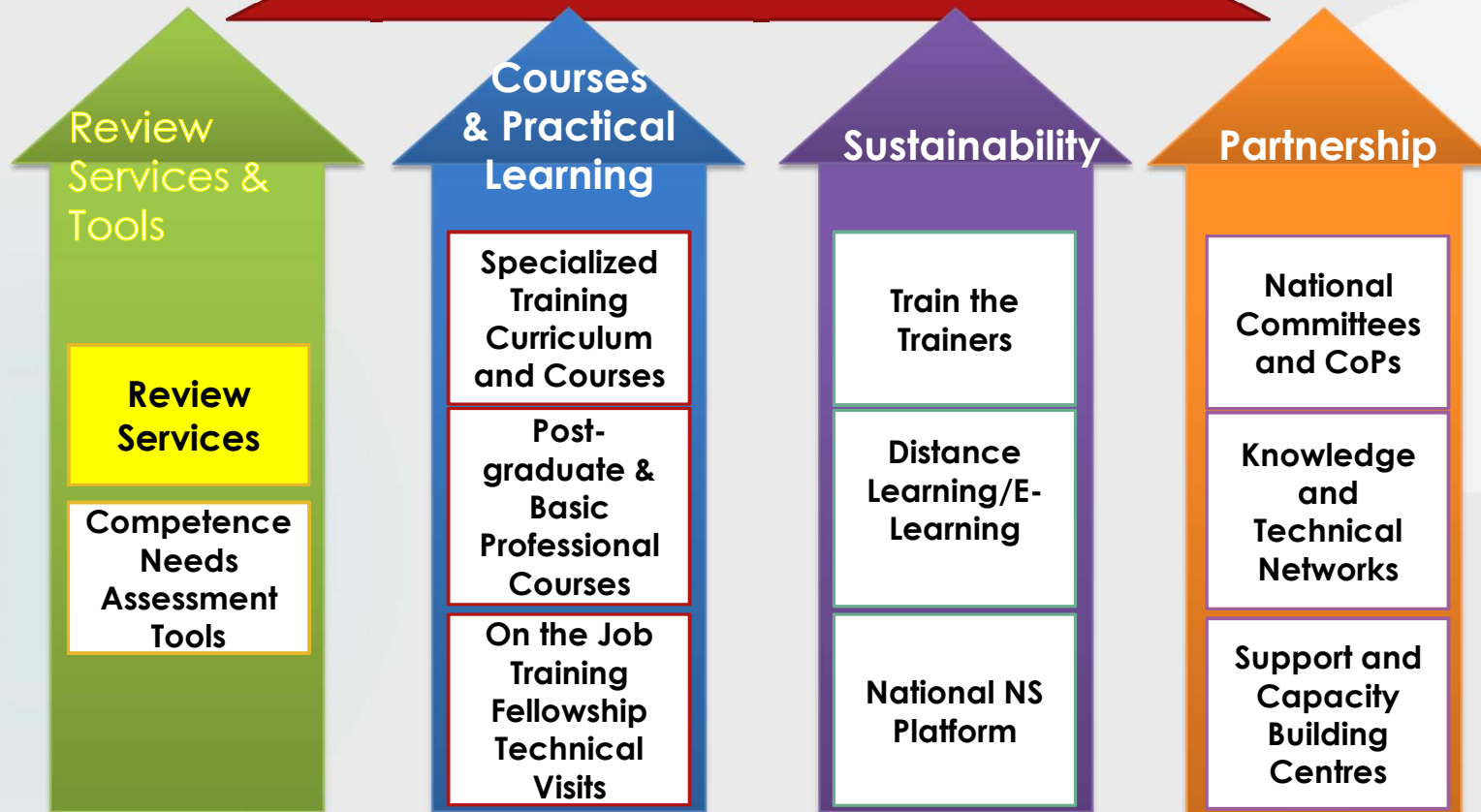
At the national level, the Capacity building efforts must be translated into specific organization priorities, making all of these institutions collectively responsible for achieving results through effective coordination.

# What is Capacity Building?

- ▶ A **systematic** and **integrated** approach to develop and **continuously** improve governmental, organizational and individual **competences** and **capabilities** necessary for achieving a safe, secure and sustainable nuclear power programme.



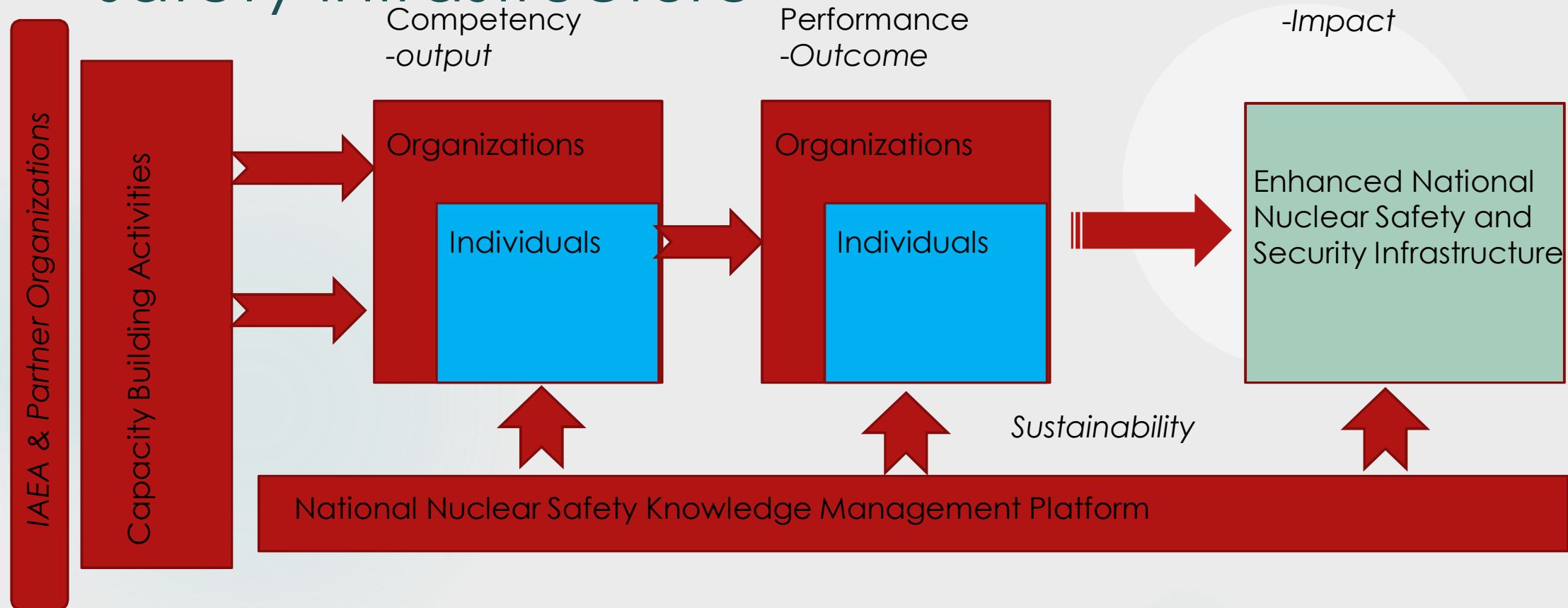
# National Capacity Building Framework

# Capacity building supporting MS safety infrastructure



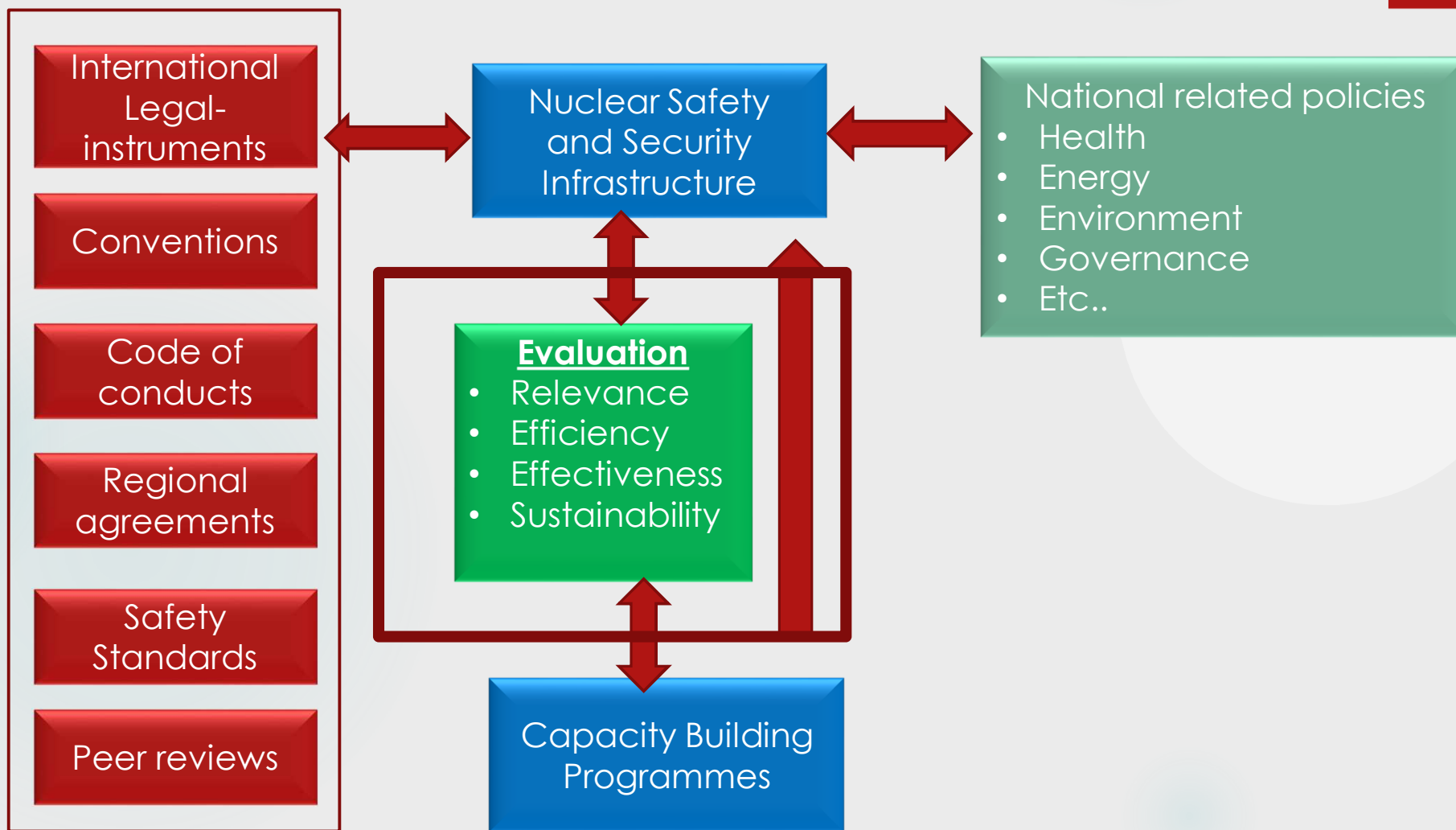
# Managing for results



- Performance Indicator for each phase of capacity building cycle
- The self-assessment → baseline
- Breaking down strategic planning into operational level → delivering outputs
- The process of converting inputs to outputs
- Collecting data
- A formal, overall assessment

# Reporting and Compliance



- One common integrated report
- Reporting format will be approved by Steering Committee
- Based on pre-defined Performance Indicators
- Qualitative and Quantitative report
- Report will include best practices
