International Nuclear Security Conference 2016: Background

- Followed the first Conference, which took place in July 2013
- Considered a success with 1300 participants and 34 Ministers in the Ministerial Segment
- 6 High level Sessions and 12 Technical Sessions
- Lot has happened since in the area of Nuclear Security
 - 2 Nuclear Security Summits
 - A/CPPNM

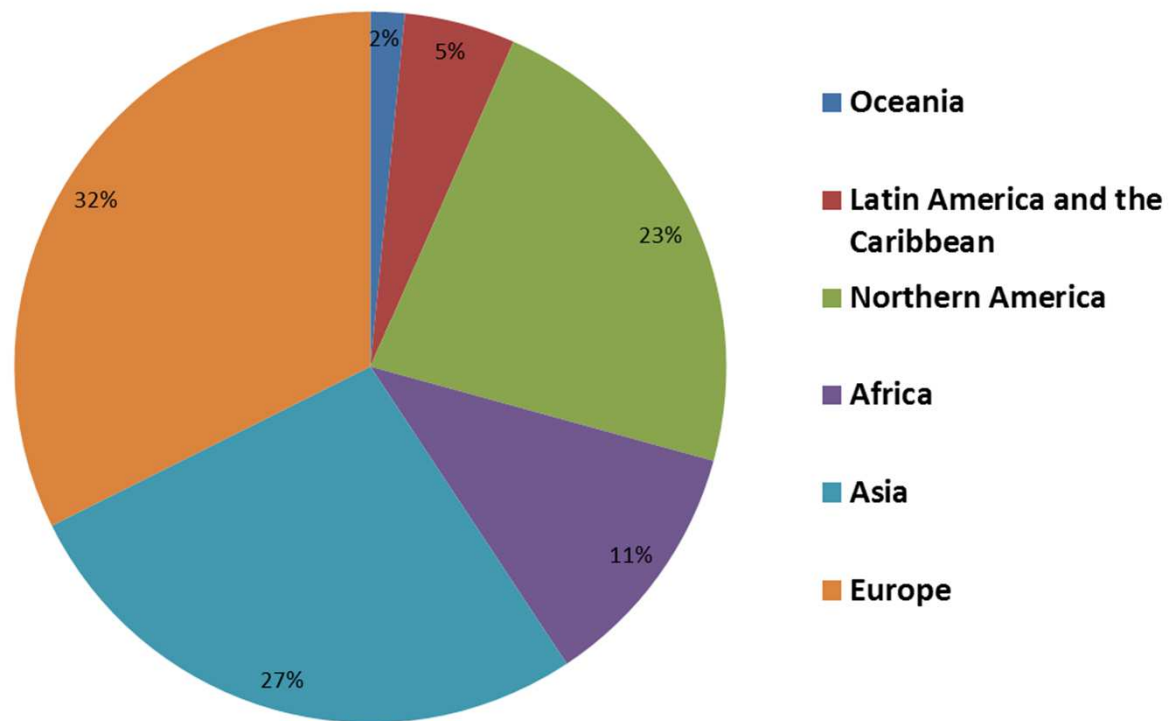
International Nuclear Security Conference 2016: Outcomes

- The conference attracted a wide variety of participants, including ministers, senior officials and technical and legal experts working in all areas of nuclear security
- The Conference attracted more than 2100 participants from 139 Member States with 47 represented at Ministerial Level
- The Conference resulted two key outcomes:
 - Ministerial Declaration adopted by Consensus
 - President's Report on the Scientific and Technical Programme (currently being finalised)

Key Statistics of the Conference

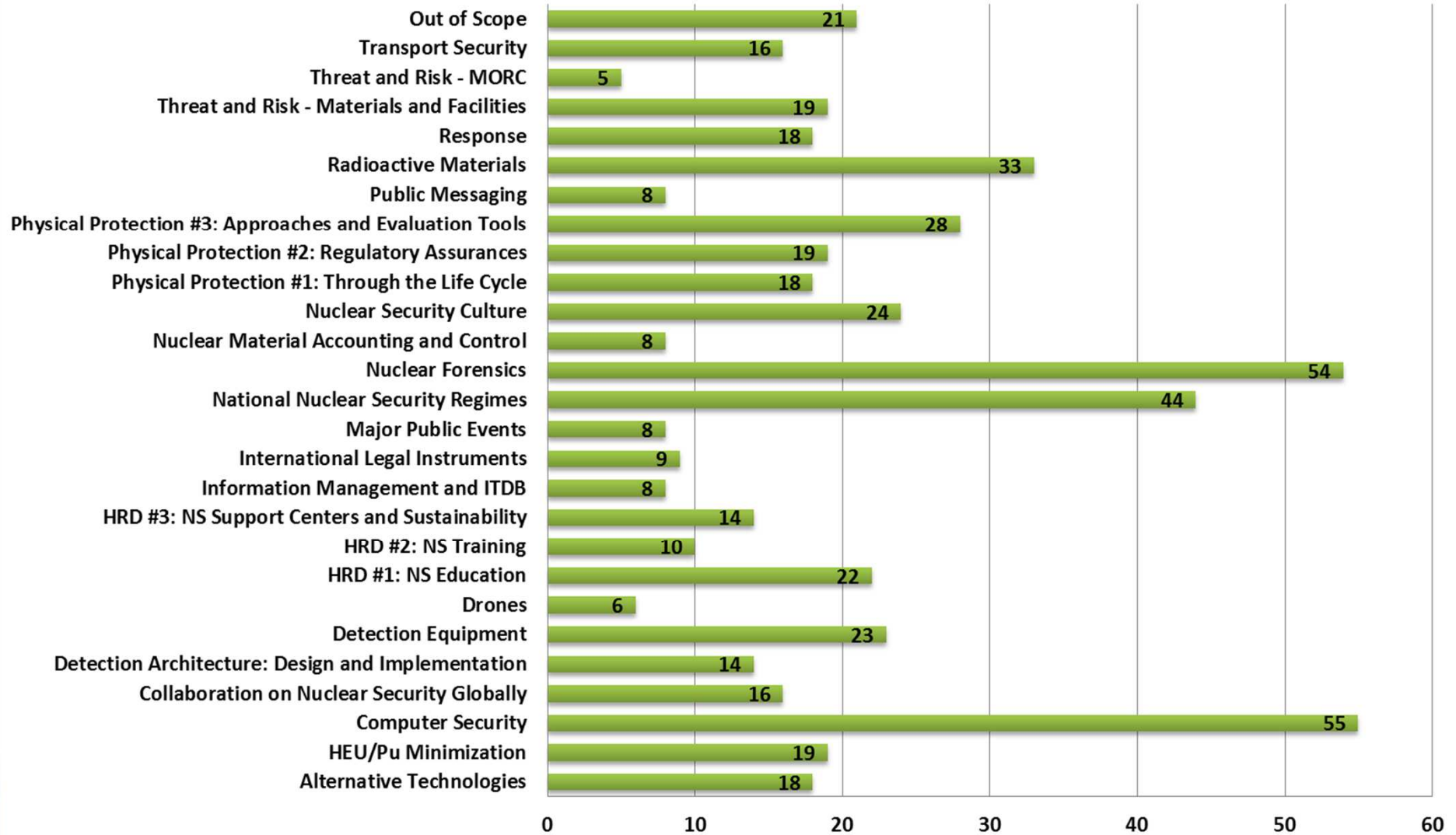
- Participants: **2100 (60% increase)**
- Ministerial representation: **47 (40% increase)**
- National Statements and Statements on behalf of groups – **90 (30% increase)**
- Abstracts Submitted: **575 (140% increase)**
- Member States: **139 (11% increase)**
- Cooperating Organizations: **17**
- Organizations represented: **29**
- Exhibitors: **60**
- High Level Sessions: **6**
- Parallel Technical Sessions: **31 (160% increase)**

International Nuclear Security Conference 2016: Outcomes

The Conference proved to be the ideal forum to:

- Raise awareness of nuclear security;
- Review the current status of nuclear security efforts and existing approaches, emerging trends and areas that need to be addressed;
- Consider the medium and long term objectives and priorities for nuclear security and how current approaches may evolve to address these and to meet future challenges;
- Reaffirm and support the central role of the IAEA in strengthening the nuclear security framework globally and leading the coordination of international activities in the field of nuclear security, whilst avoiding duplication and overlap;

International Nuclear Security Conference 2016: Outcomes

- The Conference was an inclusive forum to formulate and exchange ideas on how to improve nuclear security globally.
- The Conference underscored the commitment of the international community as a whole to nuclear security and the unique platform that the IAEA offers to assist Member States in further strengthening a global response to a global threat.
- Inputs into the Nuclear Security Plan 2018-2021 which will be the subject of consultation with Member States commencing in January 2017.

What did we learn from the Conference?

- Certain aspects related to Nuclear Security remain very contentious among the Member States:
 - Financial Support for Nuclear Security activities at the IAEA
 - Nuclear Security of Military Materials
 - Connection between Nuclear Security and Disarmament
- The Member States want to keep discussing this issue at a high-level (every three years)
