Introduction

This School is part of a series of international and regional schools on nuclear security that the IAEA implements in many regions and in a variety of languages.

The School first piloted as a joint ICTP-IAEA activity in Trieste, Italy, in 2011, and has been implemented there as the International School on Nuclear Security ever since. Given the very high demand for the School, the IAEA decided to implement additional Regional Schools. The School in Morocco is being implemented every two years since 2017 for the countries of the region.

The School will consist of a series of lectures and practical exercises, designed to incorporate the acquired knowledge into national planning and procedures to protect against threats to nuclear security.

Objectives

The objective of the School is to offer early career professionals from developing countries the opportunity to learn, understand and explore a broad spectrum of topics in nuclear security and enhance their skills in the field.

Target Audience

Participants should be early career professionals from developing French-speaking countries in Africa, ideally with 1-3 years of experience, working at an institution within their respective country with responsibilities for ensuring some aspects of nuclear security.

Working Language(s)

French

Participation and Registration

All persons wishing to participate in the event have to be designated by an IAEA Member State or should be members of organizations that have been invited to attend.

In order to be designated by an IAEA Member State, participants are requested to send the **Participation Form (Form A)** to their competent national authority (e.g. Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Permanent Mission to the IAEA or National Atomic Energy Authority) for onward transmission to the IAEA by **1 July 2019**. Participants who are members of an organization invited to attend are requested to send the **Participation Form (Form A)** through their organization to the IAEA by above deadline.

Selected participants will be informed in due course on the procedures to be followed with regard to administrative and financial matters.

Please note that the IAEA is in a transition phase to manage the entire registration process for all regular programme events electronically through the new InTouch+ (<https://intouchplus.iaea.org>) facility, which is the improved and expanded successor to the InTouch platform that has been used in recent years for the IAEA's technical cooperation events. Through InTouch+, prospective participants will be able to apply for events and submit all required documents online. National authorities will be able to use InTouch+ to review and approve these applications. Interested parties that would like to

Expenditures and Grants

No registration fee is charged to participants.

The IAEA is generally not in a position to bear the travel and other costs of participants in the event. The IAEA has, however, limited funds at its disposal to help meet the cost of attendance of certain participants. Upon specific request, such assistance may be offered to normally one participant per country, provided that, in the IAEA's view, the participant will make an important contribution to the event.

The application for financial support should be made using the **Grant Application Form (Form C)** which has to be stamped, signed and submitted by the competent national authority to the IAEA together with the **Participation Form (Form A)** by **1 July 2019**.

Visas

Participants who require a visa to enter Morocco should submit the necessary application as soon as possible to the nearest diplomatic or consular representative of Morocco.
