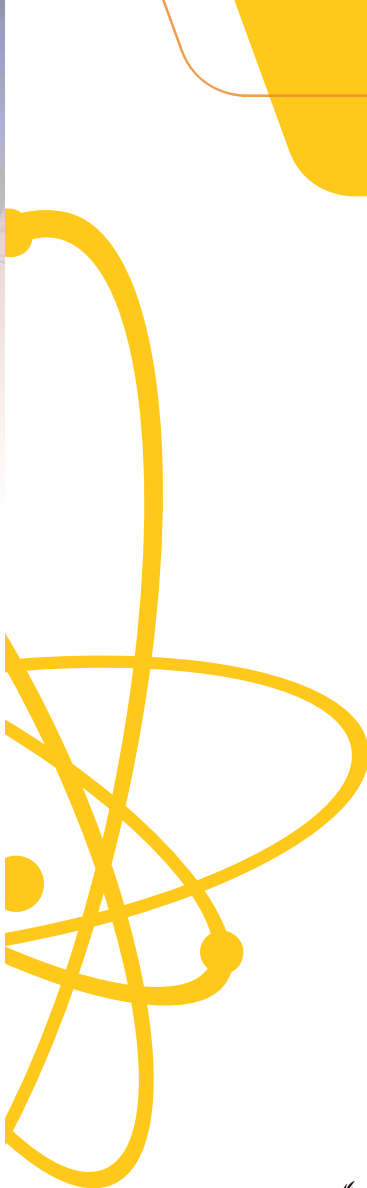




IAEA INCIDENT AND EMERGENCY CENTRE

The iNET-EPR is a mutually supportive network bringing together academic educators and training professionals in emergency preparedness and response (EPR) organizations worldwide that are committed to the development and enhancement of EPR-related education and training activities. It contributes to global efforts to create, enhance and sustain capacity building in EPR, including an effective and collaborative network of Capacity Building Centres for EPR (CBCs-EPR).
