Objectives:

The objectives of this third International Conference on Effective Nuclear Regulatory Systems were to review and assess ways to further improve the effectiveness of regulatory systems for facilities and activities taking into account lessons learned from the Fukushima Daiichi accident, and to propose specific actions in order to:

- enhance regulatory measures aimed at minimizing the occurrence and the consequences of nuclear accidents;
- enhance transparency and communication among regulators and relevant stakeholders;
- strengthen international cooperation of emergency management;
- support establishing and strengthening the regulatory framework for emerging programs;
- enhance safety and security culture taking into account human and organizational factors.
